

Project Management for the APMP Examination

OVERVIEW

The APMP is the professional qualification awarded by the Association for Project Management. The focus of this intensive course is to provide participants with a level of knowledge that will enhance their personal effectiveness in project management and give them a professional qualification that is recognised worldwide.

The syllabus is based upon the Body of Knowledge (BoK). The sessions will include discussions, exercises, case studies and example questions. Given the intensive nature of the syllabus the course will involve at least two hours of study each evening. The examination consists of a three hour essay style paper.

APMP is a knowledge based qualification. Successful candidates are able to participate in projects from individual assignments through to large capital projects. APMP is a qualification recognised both nationally and internationally that successful candidates can carry from one job to another or from one industry to another.

APMP covers 37 knowledge areas from the APM Body of Knowledge. Knowledge of these areas is considered fundamental to the professional management of projects.
